DO HEREBY PROCLAIM

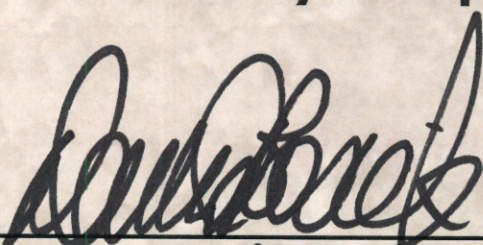
