Special Conditions:

You must obtain a permit before you can burn, and the permit must be posted on-site or be in your possession while burning. The permit costs \$50.00 and is valid for a period of three (3) days.

The permit can be obtained at the City of Dauphin Administration Office during regular business hours.

No burning is permitted before 8:00 a.m. or after 4:00 p.m.

The burn regulations are listed below:

1. The materials shall be arranged in small piles to facilitate burning and shall be free of waste material such as tires, rubbish, tar paper, plastic, poison oak, construction materials, household garbage, etc. The use of any combustible and/or flammable liquid as starting fuels is expressly prohibited.
2. Open burning shall **NOT** be conducted within 50 feet of any building, structure, property line, overhead powerlines, or other combustible material.
EXCEPTION: Not less than 25 feet when the pile size is three feet or less in diameter and two feet or less in height.
3. A water supply shall be readily available for use at open burning sites. A competent adult, with a shovel, shall supervise the burning material until the fire has been extinguished.
4. Open-air burning must **NOT** be conducted under the following weather conditions:
 - > During rain or fog (smoke cannot disperse properly).
 - > When wind speeds are high or wind direction changes frequently (fire may spread rapidly).
5. Open burning may be immediately discontinued if it is determined that it constitutes a hazardous condition.
6. All burning in an incinerator is prohibited.

This information in no way relieves your responsibilities to neighboring properties and to burn in the prescribed manner. No person shall allow a fire kindled or attended by them to escape their control. Failure to burn within the requirements may result in a citation and you may be liable for all fire suppression costs.

Fire Prevention Division Staff will discuss your proposal with you and will be looking for additional information and a site plan drawing showing:

- > Location of the fire on your property
- > Proximity of the fire to property lines, structures and roadways
- > Type of material to be burned and the number of burn piles
- > Method to extinguish the fire if necessary
- > Proposed dates for the burn
- > Access to the burn location (if required by emergency response crews)

If necessary, Fire Prevention Division staff may conduct an inspection of the site for the proposed burn.

When properly validated, this is your permit.
